SCHOOL PLAN FOR SHARED STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

What is it? This is a plan that describes how McEver Arts Academy will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. McEver Arts Academy values the contributions and involvement of parents in order to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that McEver Arts Academy will support parent engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it developed? McEver Arts Academy invites all parents to attend a parent involvement committee to develop and revise a parent involvement policy, as well as the school wide improvement plan, school-parent compact, and the parent involvement budget. Our school welcomes parent input and comments at any time regarding the plan. All parent feedback will be used to revise the plan. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and post feedback throughout the year. We also distribute an annual survey for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for parent involvement.

Who is it for? All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. McEver Arts Academy will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available? At the beginning of the year, after revision, the plan will be available in the office. The plan will also be posted on our school website (mcever.hallco.org).

2020-21 District Goals

1. By the end of FY21, the percentage of students in each subgroup moving into the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance on the Georgia Milestone Assessments will increase by 2% in the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance.
2. By the end of FY21, the "Closing the Gaps" score will increase by 10% (based on FY19 "Closing the Gaps" score) at each level (elementary, middle, and high).
3. By the end of FY21, the percentage of Economically Disadvantaged students moving into the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance on the Georgia Milestones ELA Assessments will increase by 3% in the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance.

2020-21 School Goals

*During the 2020-2021 school year, McEver will increase by 3% the number of students reading/writing at or above appropriate grade level.

*During the 2020-2021 school year, McEver: will have 90% of students master 90% of their required math facts in Grades K-5, as measured by Hall County Schools Math Fluency Benchmarks & Moby Max.

*By May 2021, McEver will increase the number of teachers implementing Arts Integration lessons into their lesson plans at least once a week from 50% to 100%.

SCHOOL-PARENT COMPACTS

As part of this plan, McEver Arts Academy and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop together that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. 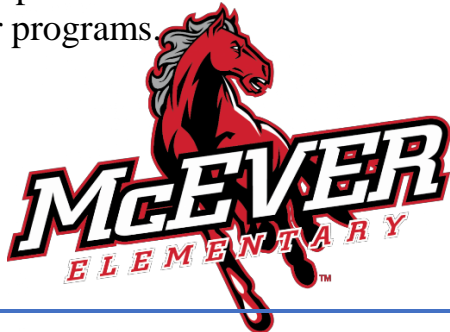
PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

- ✓ Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding school wide events and activities, through phone messages, social media, and newsletters.
- ✓ Provide necessary materials and handouts for parents at conferences, meetings, and activities to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement.
- ✓ Use our Partners in Education and School-Community Team to improve awareness of the activities and events listed in the school parent and family engagement policy.
- ✓ Offer literacy classes for parents and family members to help further enhance their various educational levels-once we are able to open the school back up to parents or we can offer Zoom.
- ✓ Collect feedback from parents and family members at all virtual events and post a suggestion form on the school website in order to respond to parents' requests for additional support for parent and family engagement activities.
